Satisfactory progress towards the B.A. in English in the Pre-Law Track of the Literature, Language, and Culture Option requires that, upon having attempted 72 credits (including transfer, advanced placement, advanced standing, credit by examination, and course withdrawal), students must have passed 12 of the required credits in Section I and have attained a GPA of 2.0 or better both within the major and overall.

In order to enroll in the Law Track of the Literature, Language, and Culture Option, students must have completed both 2515 and 2516 and either 2525 or 2526 with an average of 2.0 or better and have completed 2604 with a grade of C or better.

In order to graduate, students must complete their degrees with a GPA of 2.0 or better both within the English major and overall. All English courses (except 1105, 1106, H1204) are factored into the in-major GPA.

IV. University Liberal Education Requirements**36 hours**

Students who first enrolled in the university in the fall of 2005 and who graduate in 2009 are subject to the Speaking/Visual/Writing requirement. Students in this situation should see their advisors for information about how this requirement will be satisfied and documented for the purpose of satisfying graduation requirements. It is the policy of the English Department that no student will be adversely affected by this requirement if courses and/or experiences are not yet in place for them to complete prior to graduation.
